Quilt Show 2014 Report

The Quilt Show was held on the second weekend in July at the Wellington Ess-roc Arena. Approximately 1315 people attended over the two days. Our Featured Artists were Elizabeth Dillinger, an award winning textile artist and Quinte Fiber Artists, a group of ten local fiber artists which included some of our very own members. Bethany Garner was our Certified Judge. Rosalie Tennison was scheduled to be our quilt appraiser but she forgot to attend and her only contact information was her home phone. After negotiations, we have received a cheque for six appraisal fees.

The in memoriam tribute for three of our members Dorothy Dunn, Betty DeMille and Connie Sirot included the framed articles from the newsletter and samples of Dorothy and Connie's handiwork.

239 entries made for a fantastic, big show. Our member's quilts were very beautiful. Many visitors complimented our work and said it was better than Quilt Canada. I agree.

Meetings began in the late fall of 2013 and continued to August 2014. We met once a month after January 2013. This seemed to be enough time to plan and organize the show. Your program and each meeting chair is listed for the upcoming year. We hope that this will help you plan ahead.


In the spring, we will be asking for a new committee to organize 2015-2016. Please seriously consider putting your name forth.



## 1. Be inspired

Due: January 2015


*Challenge your creativity using a box top to sew a placemat(s) for yourself or to donate it to the County's meals-on-wheels program*

### Guidelines:

- *choose a box from our bag or choose one of your own liking*
- *use the box top to inspire your fabric choice, colour choices, and/or design for the placemat(s)*
- *box top must be submitted with the placemat(s) for judging*

Techniques: *your choice*

Judging: *will be done by Guild members at the January 2015 meeting on the basis of*  
*a) creativity*  
*b) design*



## 2. Mosaic Cushion/small mural

Due: May 2015

*Challenge yourself to create a mosaic picture "with a twist"*

### Guidelines:


- *prepare a mosaic mural*
- *add an applique/silhouette to your mosaic*
- *size can range from a cushion cover to a small mural with maximum perimeter of 72".*

Techniques: ( ref.: "Luminous Landscapes", "Radiant Landscapes" by Gloria Loughman)

- *mosaic background*
- *hand or machine applique added to the mosaic picture*

Judging: *will be done by Guild members at the May 2015 meeting on the basis of:*

- a) visual impact*
- b) creativity*
- c) workmanship*



# Prince Edward County Quilter's Guild Challenges 2015-2016

*This is a brief overview of the challenges that will be presented for next year. More detailed information will be provided for each challenge in May 2015.*

## 1. Pet Frenzy:

**Due date: October 2016**



*Use "orphan blocks" / left-over fabric / scraps to create simple mini quilts, for dogs and cats who are waiting for a "forever home"*

*In this challenge, the more 24"X36" quilts you make the greater are your chances of winning a prize .*

## 2. Window on the County

**Due date: January 2016**

*A County poster will be cut into pieces. Your challenge will be to reproduce into 12½" square your piece of the poster. The pieces will then be joined and quilted to create a mural of the County.*



## 3. Modern Twist on Quilts

**Due date: May 2016**

- Learn about "modern" quilts from guild activities, books, magazines, the internet.*
- Then create a "modern" bed quilt.*
- size can range from a baby or lap quilt to a full sized king bed quilt.*
