#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



### Book Duster/Cover Challenge

Hello ladies, sorry for the delay in sending this. I have been away. There are a lot of examples and tutorials on Pinterest. However the simplest directions are as follows:

- Measure book closed, this allows for thick ness - mine measured 11 1/2 wide by 8 1/2 high
- I added 4 inches to width: 15 1/2
- And 2 inches to height: 10 1/2, I think 1" would have been ok
- I did 1/4 seam allowance
- I did mine in two fabrics, so I just sewed around my fabrics and light batting turned to right sides, top stitch and voila. Done.

I am having trouble feeding our @quiltsinthecounty social media platforms.




#### **BOOK REVIEWS**



Workshop #2 Trina O'Rourke, owner of The Cotton Harvest and licensed teacher for the Sue Spargo embroidery method, will teach us embroidery stitches using Sue Spargo's second edition book.

Cost is \$25 with an additional kit fee of \$25. Kit includes wool circles and background as well as four different embroidery needles. Various specialty threads are free to use at the workshop. Kits will be handed out at the April Meeting as you have a little homework before the workshop.




